

Can you build the perfect rescue box for your Young Vets Club patient?

When animals need help, vets often have to transport them safely to clinics or shelters. Your mission is to create a comfy, secure travel carrier for your Young Vets Club cuddly toy – whether it's Valery, Masikio, Cali or Bear, let's help them travel in safety and style!

YOU'LL NEED:

- A small cardboard box (shoe box or delivery box works best)
- Scissors (ask an adult for help)
- Glue, tape, pens (and anything else for decoration!)
- A clean tea towel
- Toilet roll tube
- Choose your box and check your patient will fit inside comfortably
- Cut out a door on one short side
 - Ask an adult to help cut three sides of a rectangle (like a flap)
 - Leave the fourth side attached so it swings open like a real carrier door!

Optional: attach string or ribbon to tie it closed

- **3.** Poke small air holes around the sides for airflow
- Decorate the outside to show it's an official YVC rescue box! You could write "ANIMAL IN TRANSIT" and their name
- 5. Line it with a tea towel to make a cosy nest inside
- Cut a toilet roll tube in half for your water/feed bowl

WHY IT MATTERS:

Real animals can get stressed during travel, so it's important to:

- Make them feel safe with a sturdy carrier and soft bedding
- Keep them cool and calm with fresh air
- Plan breaks during long journeys for water and rest

ADDITIONAL CHALLENGE

Fill out your patient record for Bear, Cali, Masikio or Valery. That way, when they arrive at the clinic, you and the team will have the best chance of getting them the correct care right away!
